No PBCCA Meeting on June 14

Because the June meeting is scheduled to take place on June 14 Election Day, the Penn Branch Citizens Civic Association meeting is cancelled. Instead, we encourage residents to vote, as well as volunteer at the polls or assist in helping seniors get out to vote. Voters will select which candidate will represent Ward 7 in the fall general election: Incumbent, Yvette Alexander; former mayor and city council chairman, Vincent Grav; Grant **Thompson** and **Delmar Chelsey**. Voters will also select the Democratic nominee for president, Delegate to the US House of Representatives: At-Large City Council: Incumbent, Vincent Orange; Robert White, and David Garber, voters will also vote for US 'Shadow Representative', National Committeeperson, Republican Party; Local Party Committee Member, Republican Party. In other races, east of the River, voters will also vote for Ward 8 city council person, incumbent, **LaRuby** May; Trayon White, Maurice Dickens, Aaron Holmes, and Bonita Goode. The next PBCCA meeting will take place Tuesday, September 13, 2016.

Welcome 2016-2017 PBCCA Officers

Penn Branch members elected new officers at the May community meeting. The community reelected Jimmie Williams, President, Roy Ward, Vice President, Matt Pinardi Treasurer, Towana Banks, Recording Secretary, and Jacquelyn **Cannon**, Correspondence Secretary; the position of Parliamentarian remains open, and according to PBCCA bylaws the President can appoint someone to fill the position. "I am looking forward to working to improve our community," said Jacquelyn Cannon who will serve as an officer for the first time. "We've accomplished a lot, but have a lot more work to do including moving forward with a senior's health and wellness citizens committee, fundraising and building our network of community volunteers", said President Jimmie

Housing Update

The real estate market has been extremely hot in Penn Branch. Listed homes are quickly being purchased and the value has risen consistently. This has sparked the banks to release properties on Texas Avenue and Highwood Drive for sale. Both properties have been nuisance properties and empty for years. We hope that the other empty properties will soon be sold to responsible owner who occupy the properties. We are happy to say that the Housing Committee will have two less nuisance properties to track and the community will gain a new neighbor. We hope this trend continues because it means less vacant homes and a growing Penn Branch community. We also will continue to work with property owners and city officials to address nuisance properties and problem residents.

Penn Branch Shopping Center Updates

Major parking lot repairs are scheduled to begin in



the front side of Penn Branch Shopping Center in July. We will share details in a special update this month.

that a health club, Uber and Children's Health might be considering locating at the shopping center. However, none of these rumors have been confirmed, and it is the policy of Rappaport Management, not to comment on perspectives given that nothing is certain until leases are

Eagle Scout "Rudy Schrieber"

Congratulations to our neighbor **Rudy Schrieber**, **Jr.** who just graduated from Duke Ellington School of the Arts, received a Lloyd Smith Scholarship, and earned the Boy Scouts highest rank achievable in the Boy Scouts program - Eagle Scout badge. Rudy is a member of Boy Scout Troup 500 on Capitol Hill. The designation "Eagle Scout" has a long history since its founding over one hundred years ago. Only four percent of Boy Scouts are granted this rank after a lengthy review process. The requirements necessary to achieve this rank take years to fulfill. Rudy has been active in the Penn Branch community, attending meetings, cleaning 9-11 Park.

Rudy led two high adventure trips as a Boy Scout, a seven-day sailing trip beginning at Sea Base Islamorada Florida and sailing from Key West to Key Largo of the Florida Keys, and a nine-day hiking trip at elevations above 9,000 feet in New Mexico at the Philmont Scout Ranch; participated in a nine-day high adventure canoeing trip in the Adirondacks and another Sea Base high adventure trip in the Florida Keys;

He completed his Eagle Scout project benefitting Fort Dupont by creating an education garden adjacent to the park offices, refurbishing an existing accessible garden at the East end of the park, and painting blazes for an unmarked trail in the park;

Cats and Dogs – Please remember to tag your cats, and dogs. Several neighbors have raised concerns about cats roaming the area without collars or identification. The Humane Society will catch, trap, spay and release most untagged cats.
