Crime Never Takes a Holiday!

Although we are a fairly low-crime community, recently there have been reports of thefts in and around Penn Branch. An armed robbery was reported in early December on Highwood Drive. On Carpenter Street, an attempted break-in was reported and delivered packages were stolen from another residence. Several residents have installed security cameras and received rebates through the D.C. Security Camera Program. We are urging Penn Branch residents to purchase security cameras. The cameras are a deterrent, they aid in catching criminals. When residents exercise security precautions, by working with MPD, it provides another layer of security.
